Bryce, Arizona Post Office

In 2022 we discovered the Postal History Foundation located in Tucson. The librarian there was very helpful in researching information about the Bryce, Arizona post office. Yes, there used to be a post office in Bryce! It opened on 5 August 1891 and was discontinued 28 February 1922.

Attached is a photograph of Annie Elnora Bryce standing in front of the Bryce Post Office (1912). When her father, Heber Brooks Bryce was the postmaster from April 1915 to April 1918, she served as assistant postmaster. Later, she took the Civil Service Examination for postal clerks and was appointed to work in the Safford post office.

On a side note, Annie was a member of the Mt. Graham stake Genealogical Committee. There is no way to know how many hundreds of hours nor how much of her personal money she spent in doing genealogical research. She had researched the Bryce and Park lines back to the thirteenth century. Elnora and her Aunt Jane Mattice were instrumental in starting the Bryce Family Organization and she was the family genealogist until her death.

Years ago, Ben Bryce saw a postmarked postcard on eBay from Bryce, Arizona. Ben purchased it. In January of 2023, he offered the postcard to the Ebenezer Bryce Foundation.

The post office stamp reads: Bryce, Ariz., September 24, 1909 A.M.

It is addressed to Flossie Whipple, Clifton, Arizona on 23 September 1909.

"Hello Flossie, I received your card day before yesterday. Tell Lealand hello for me. I would like to see you all. How is Clifton? I expect fine. How does Lealand feel? Alice is all worked up. How is your mamma? I am going to school. Bryce is as dull as ever. You must come back and see us all." Carlotta Box 332

We have laughed about Bryce being "as dull as ever." Nowadays, that's exactly what we like about Bryce. Calm and quiet!

Another search on eBay revealed a U.S. stamp printed in 2006 of Bryce Canyon National Park.



This department has accepted the offer of the London office to accept ordinary and registered letters, postal cards, printed matter, samples of merchandise and commercial papers, except parcelapost packages, for transmission to Bagdad and northern Persia (Isphahan, Teheran, etc.), and to places as far south as Bushire, at the rate of 15 cemts an ounce or fraction thereof, and didition to the international rate of postage required, the air mail fee and the postage to be paid by postage stamps affixed to each piece. Mail matter intended for dispatch by the Cairo-Bagdad Air Mail Service should bear in the upper left-hand corner of the envelope or cover, a blue label with the words "By Air-Cairo-Bagdad," or in lieu of the label be prominently marked as indicated so that the articles in assorting may not be overlooked.
